CRAFT: Farm Animal Faces



Supplies needed: paper plates, construction paper ears & noses for each animal, cotton balls, glue sticks, black markers or colored pencils


Snack: Animal Crackers

Parents: At the end of this discussion guide, you will find the animal face templates as well as three fun printable activities for your preschoolers. Enjoy!


SHEEP FACE TEMPLATE










PIG FACE TEMPLATE













DUCK FACE TEMPLATE



After you cut the "beak" out, fold in half and only glue on half of one side (so mouth opens)









Cardstock. Cut it apart and then have your little one put


Print the puzzle on cardstock. Cut it your little one put them back together.






YOU ARE JUST WRITE!

Begin at the picture and trace the line all the way to the right side of the paper.


















Practice cutting skills by cutting from the edge of the paper to the animals. Be careful NOT to cut the animals!
