Strengthening the Church in Latin America December 2016

Pastor Quispe

Meet pastor Juan Jose Quispe. He pastors a small church on the Bolivian Altiplano and leads an Evangelical denomination of 50 churches. Two years ago he completed our three-year Equipping Servants (ESI) pastoral training. This past January he stepped into our twoyear intensive mentoring Pastoral Assistant (PA) volunteer program. He's a busy man -- in addition to teaching at the Pedro Domingo Murillo Technical Insti-



tute downtown La Paz for three days a week, he pastors his church, leads his denomination, leads one ESI group, and dedicates 16 hours each week to studying through Roman and preparing messages to meet twice a week with our PA volunteers to preach, evaluate messages, and walk life and ministry together.

Juan Jose's testimony points to God's amazing grace, as every genuine testimony does! It starts with his great grandfather, who came to faith in Christ out of very unusual circumstances. His great grandfather was one of the early converts in Bolivia - the gospel arrived in Bolivia in the final days of the 1800's. So the fact that this man was willing to identify himself with Jesus at a time when believers were persecuted and even martyred for their faith -- is surprising enough. But what's even more astonishing is that his great grandfather was a Shaman (witch doctor) in his Aymara community. The Quispe's were farmers living in small Aymara communities on the 14,000' windswept Bolivian Altiplano (High Plateau). His great grandfather was the spiritual and political leader of his community.

One day his great grandfather got into a fight with another Shaman over community land-rights. The other Shaman placed a curse on him. The curse was believed to be so strong that his great grandfather was forced to go to the strongest Shamans to rid himself of it. These strongest Shamans purportedly live in Cochabamba, Bolivia and Brazil. His condition worsened until he was completely bed-ridden. Desperate for life, he finally asked his family members to take him to the Shaman who had placed the curse on him. This Shaman, gleeful that Juan Jose's great grandfather was dying, told him to read the gospel of Mark as part of his final death blow. (All Andean Shamans apparently have Bibles as part of their ritual collection.)

So his great grandfather did read Mark, but instead of the coup de grace the witch doctor desired for him, the Holy Spirit spoke into his life. Juan Jose's great grandfather wept his way through Mark. Upon finishing, he gave his life to Jesus. The Lord granted him both spiritual salvation and physical healing – and afterwards he lived a long life as an early Christian evangelist among the Aymara people. God's grace in the Quispe family impacted not only this man but also his son, grandchildren and great grandchildren. As a small boy Juan Jose saw his need for Jesus and asked the Lord to forgive his sins and save him. Today Juan Jose serves Jesus as a pastor among his Aymara people -- and is one of our ESI leaders.
