No Shut Doors

Recently reading Revelation 3, one verse caught my attention. Jesus says, "Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power...".

The church in Philadelphia, pressed by society and civil authorities bent on silencing its gospel-message, faced an enormous decision. Do we keep silent and avoid ridicule/ persecution, or do we speak out and risk ostracism? Roman protocol discouraged the introduction of new deities and ideas into towns and cities (with the exception of Athens). Both Plato and Caesar Augustus set the norm: "local traditions/ religion/ philosophy encourage stability, while change disrupts civic harmony". So to speak to friends and neighbors about their need for this 'new' Savior Jesus and His Salvation was to risk more than just personal reproach.


Face it, believers in themselves had no power to affect the might of Rome. And as persecution mounted, it could even appear to believers that the door was closing or shut for the gospel in Philadelphia. But Jesus, our higher authority, had commanded, "Go and preach the gospel to everyone". His mandate has not changed! Then to this charge He adds, "Others may try to shut the door, but I will keep it open. So don't shrink back – preach the gospel! Be bold".

In a world that continues to define what is socially acceptable and politically correct – our mandate remains firm. Jesus our Lord presses us to take His message of eternal salvation to the lost, to our friend without Christ, to our colleague who does not believe. Without Jesus, he/she is eternally lost. Do we accept possible rejection and ridicule to love them with God's love and lead them to the Savior?!?

God's plan is to redeem a broken world. That's why Jesus is keeping the door open! To trust His Sovereign rule in our lives is to not shrink back – it's to speak up! So boldly and lovingly proclaim the Word of life!
