Boat Craft: This simple craft uses recycled juice boxes, including the straw. You will also need Scotch tape and construction paper. Feel free to encourage your preschooler to cut the triangle "sails" out on their own and color the sails before attaching to his/her juice box straw. You may want to have a large tub of water available (or your preschooler may simply decide it's bath time so he/she can take the boat in the tub!)
