## **Matthew 28 Discussion Questions**

- 1. From the following readings: Mat 27:62-66; Mark 16:1-11, Luke 24:1-12 and John 20:9:
  - A. List all the precautions Jesus' enemies took to be certain that his body could not be stolen from the grave. What reason was given for them to take these precautions?
  - B. From these readings, make a list of as many proofs as you can that none of Jesus' followers ever expected the resurrection and thought Jesus' death was the end of their hopes.
  - C. What do you see in these verses that emphasizes the historical reality of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection?
  - D. **Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-5.** This was probably part of a first century catechism. What are the truths that are taught in this first century teaching?
  - E. According to 1 Cor 15:12-28, why is the bodily resurrection of Jesus important?
- 2. Matthew 28:16-20 is known as The Great Commission. Jesus' command is for his people to make disciples of all nations.
  - a. What is the basis of Jesus' commands to His disciples?
  - b. What does Jesus command his followers do to make disciples?
  - c. What are the practicalities of fulfilling this commission?

3. **Mat 28:16-20** culminates numerous themes in Matthew's gospel. Identify several of them and note how this final scene further develops or properly climaxes each one.<sup>1</sup>
