

## Review

In the last half of chapter 1 and the beginning of chapter 2 Peter taught us that as Christians we need to *look* forward to heaven, *live* as holy children, *love* one another, and *long* for the nourishment of the Word of God. In 2:4-10 Peter reveals that, as believers we are rejected by men but chosen by God, just like Christ was. In the balance of chapter 2 he explains how to live in such a way that we reflect the character of Christ and the nature of the gospel as people subject to authorities. In the first half of chapter 3 Peter reveals key principles of reflecting the character of Christ and the nature of the gospel in the context of marriage and in the church.

- have a gentle and quiet spirit
- do good and don't fear

- be understanding of your wife
- show honor to your wife

How does understanding and honor relate to weakness and equality (in terms of inheritance)?

#### 3. Principles for all God's People (8-12)

- called to be one
- called to be a blessing How do we bless people who do evil to us or revile us?
- called to be blessed How are we blessed and why?
