

4. Why does the Psalmist tell us that it is good to sing praises to God? (V. 1) Why is it right and 'fitting' that we should praise God? How do we benefit from praising God?

- 6. What do we learn about God's power in this Psalm?
- 7. What do we learn about God's providence in this Psalm?
- 8. What do we learn about God's provision in this Psalm?

10. How does our understanding of the gospel and our knowledge of Jesus affect the way that we read and apply this Psalm?
