Praise the Lord, they decided to join us. They are an answer to prayer. They have already found a small house to rent and have joined in the activities at our small church plant. Wit, Muey and Professor Awd will take over the responsibility of the church and the teaching while we come beside them. Wit and Muey will also help disciple students who may be interested in studying the Bible. We have had a number of male students interested in knowing more about the Bible and Lord willing, good connections can be started with Wit.
