University students. We were able to have 3 Christmas parties with our



#### What God has been teaching me

In Thailand, Christmas is seen as a festival and a party. Most people do not know the true meaning of Christmas but they enjoy a party. In the busyness of outreaches, the true meaning of Christmas can get lost so I enjoyed reading through the advent devotional, *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel* by Jonathan Gibson. It helped keep my eyes focused on the true meaning of Christmas and how profound it is that God would become human to reconcile us to Him! One word kept going through my mind this season...comfort (Isaiah 40:1). It comes at a pivotal time in the book when Isaiah begins looking to the future in this chapter and reminds the Israelites that God hasn't forgotten His people. So I have chosen 'comfort' to be my Word of 2024 as I, too, look to the future and remember that He hasn't forgotten you or me either! The Hebrew word used for comfort here means to strengthen, to encourage and to instill a sense of security [John N. Oswalt]. As I enter 2024, I want to strengthen, encourage and speak of the peace that Jesus brings. I hope you find the words from this old German Christmas hymn as inspiring as I do:

"Comfort, comfort all my people; speak of peace," so says our God.
"Comfort those who sit in darkness, groaning from their sorrows' load.
Speak to all Jerusalem of the peace that waits for them;
tell them that their sins I cover, that their warfare now is over."
